#### Our 2023-24 Finances

The accounting statement for the year 1st April 2023 - 31st March 2024 is shown on the preceeding page for your information.

It may look particularly healthy in light of the many concerns around public funds and spending at the present time.

This is a snap shot of where we were as at 31st March 2024. During the six month period up to this date we had experienced a number of issues which took up a lot of time and energy and did not enable us to complete various projects or give us time to discuss and make future plans as well as we had hoped. But that's how it goes sometimes and we just have to make the best we can in these situations.

Which is what we endeavour to do with all our funds. Every penny is accountable and we want the best we can for what we spent on your behalf. We have carried forward the following commitments:

£9.5K - Community Infrastructure Levy received in September 2023. We have 5 years to spend this but it does come with certain criteria.

£5K - towards the Pound Junction works due to start soon.

New Planters and/or Signage for the Village Entrances (but waiting for the Pound Junction works to be completed first)

Benches - installation and maintenance

Mining Trail Signs - replacement where necessary

As is usual each year, we undertook a full external audit with an independent accountancy firm. This has provided us, and you, with the reassure that we are doing things in the right way, but there are areas that can be improved upon over the next 12 months in terms of our website, policies and publication.

#### Allotments

We currently have a few allotments available for the first time in a long time. If you are interested please contact the clerk - clerk@carharrackparishcouncil. co.uk or Cllr Val Aldridge.

This is an active allotment community and you would be made to feel most welcome.

At our last parish council meeting we agreed that one of the now unallocated plots will become a "memorial allotment plot". This is in remembrance of the people who have passed away in recent years but gave so much time, energy and friendship to this community.

#### Large Cardboard Boxes

If you are fortunate to be in receipt of a new super-sized TV, or other such item which comes in a large cardboard box can we ask, on behalf of the household recycling team, that you fold these down before putting them out for collection.


The recycling vehicle was held up for 10 minutes, blocking the road, in one area of the village recently as both the operative and the driver had to grapple with a huge box and compress it down to a size that would fit into the vehicle.

They do a great job taking away all of our recycling week on week - so please help them wherever you can.

#### And Finally - Weeds

We have for decades now been used to seeing hedges, verges, footpaths and pavements being treated with chemicals to eradicate the vegetation which has been referred to as "weeds".

As a Parish Council we refuse to use herbicides as these are so destructive and harmful to more vegetation than just "weeds". This is also a reminder that Carharrack Parish Council declared a Climate Emergency back in 2019 and everything we do has to take account of its impact on our natural environment. If you see an area which you would like to see cutback or cleared, either report this to Cornwall County in the first instance and if its not their area of responsiblity then get in touch with the Parish Council. We have a contractor we can send out or alternatively we will come out ourselves and deal with what is necessary in the best interests of the community and our wildlife.

#### Crafty Knits and Tall Yarns Third Anniversary

We can't quite believe this, but our August session marks THREE years of our gorgeous little craft group running. What came out of seeing people isolated during covid, to a whim that we thought might work for a month or two, came our truly successful and stable crafting community – now all great friends. We firmly feel that we give the warmest welcome to everyone who comes along, and there is also much laughter (and sometimes not a lot of crafting!).

We meet on the first Monday of every month in Mills Hall, from 6.30pm to 9pm (or any time in between). There is no membership subscription – we are completely flexible! The cost for each session is  $\pounds 2.50$  and this is to cover hall rental and your unlimited hot drinks and biscuits. We are entirely non-profit making and if we ever have a few busy months, the surplus entry fees get sent to Dementia UK, along with any fund-raising that we do. To date we have sent almost  $\pounds 1500$  to this charity which is very close to our hearts.

We usually have an optional free workshop at each session, but the next few are dedicated to teaching knitted and crocheted poppy-making. These are  $5^{th}$  August,  $2^{nd}$  September and  $7^{th}$  October.

You can learn to crochet or knit poppies at any of our forthcoming sessions (details below), and we can help with wool, buttons, needles and hooks. If you are unable to come to the craft group but would like to make some poppies, we'd love to have you on board! We have started to deliver wool (and patterns where needed) to people in the community, so do get in touch if you can help.

We have made a start and think we have just over 100 poppies so far (see photos from craft group 1<sup>st</sup> July) – there are prizes for the top-three producers so please get crafting and let's make this an incredible tribute from our village.



#### 20's Plenty and Traffic Speeds

No doubt you will have seen the new 20mph signs in and around our village for which we are very grateful.

We are also well aware of the continued speed of traffic exceeding this limit both through the village and around the residential areas. As a parish council we have no power to enforce the traffic speeds. When a driver gets behind the wheel of the car it is their responsibility to drive within the speed limits, to alter their driving speeds according to the weather and road conditions and respect all other road users.

St Day has a Speedwatch Team which regularly monitors the traffic. Recently in a single one hour session they caught 13 vehicles exceeding the 30mph speed limit. They have offered to support our village with a Speedwatch Team. So if you and a few friends think it's about time we did something about this rather than just complain then get in touch. Monitoring can be done monthly, fortnightly or weekly. And it could make a big difference to this issue which upsets and angers many of you.

In the meantime keep an eye on your own speeds not only through the village but when you are out and about. One of our local residents was caught driving through Chacewater by their Speedwatch Team and has kindly shared the letter they received for your information.

#### Community Speed Watch - Advice Letter

Dear Sir/Madam/To whom it may concern -Vehicle Registration: Vehicle Make / Model: Date and Time: Location:

Records show that you are the registered owner/keeper/person responsible for the above vehicle. This vehicle was observed by Community Speed Watch volunteers exceeding the speed limit.

Driving even a small amount above the speed limit or driving too fast in poor conditions increases the risk of causing a collision and increases the likelihood of those involved sustaining serious or fatal injuries.

Community Speedwatch volunteers are operating in this area due to community concerns of vehicles speeding on the roads where they live. Excess speed is one of the main factors that cause fatalities or serious injuries, and we ask your support to keeping our communities safe by driving safely and keeping to the speed limits.

No further action will be taken regarding this incident however collective speed limit non-compliance statistics will be used to inform further police enforcement in the area.

Community Speedwatch volunteers operate under the guidance and training of the police and monitor traffic speeds. Community Speedwatch volunteers cannot prosecute drivers for speeding, but police will consider taking future positive action in cases where a vehicle is repeatedly recorded travelling at excess speed.

Each year an average of 28,000 people are killed or seriously injured on the roads in the UK and research has shown that speed is a major contributory factor.

In Devon and Comwall, Community Speed Watch groups are working alongside statutory organisations in an ambitious strategy to prevent death and injury on the roads of Devon and Cornwall.
