



#### CARHARRACK METHODIST CHAPEL

In July we said farewell after eight years to our minister Rev'd Elizabeth Harris and her husband John as they left with Liz taking up a new post of superintendant minister in Droitwich, Worcestershire.

In July a farewell service attended by congregations across the Falmouth-Gwennap Circuit with a bring and share meal was held so we could all say our goodbyes and share together memories made during the previous years.

Our newly appointed minister was due to join us at the beginning of September, but sadly due to unforeseen circumstances was unable to take up the post. This leaves the Falmouth-Gwennap Circuit with one minister in charge of ten Chapels until September 2025.

Looking back over the last few months two occasions stand out. To raise some much needed funds several members took on the £10 challenge. On a parallel with the Parable of the talents (Matthew 25, verses 14-30) we were "given "£10 to go away and try our best to increase it by any means pertinent to our abilities. Results included cooking for others, inviting people for Sunday roast lunch, producing small crochet goodies, and a Sunday afternoon tea including bingo. All events and goodies were available for a donation and we found people to be very generous. Thanks to all those who supported us in this project.

The second was that of the annual community service. Representatives from ten organisations from the community were in attendance with seven parading the banners of their groups.

We are now looking towards the season of Advent and Christmas when we hope to see people of the village joining us for the Children's Nativity and Carol service which will be taking place on 15<sup>th</sup> December at 10:45 and led by the Chapel congregation.

Services each Sunday start at 10:45, and we would love to see anyone who would like to join us. We are a friendly, caring group of people who would welcome you into our church family. We are also one of only two Chapels within the circuit who have an active Junior Church.

In addition to our services we also hold regular coffee mornings on the second Thursday and the last Saturday of each month. They commence at 10:30, and have

stalls including one with very tasty cakes and pies. In November the Saturday coffee morning will include an auction. If anyone has any goods they would like to donate it would be appreciated.

## Lest We Forget



As the delivery of this issue of Carharrack News is very close to rememberance Sunday, which includes our wonderful village display of poppies it takes me back to my own story. In the 70s my stepmother who worked for the Royal British legion gave me two complementary tickets for the evening

Remembrance service in the Royal Albert Hall (little did I know the impact that evening was to have on me). I had watched it on the television many times and knew what to expect, but actually being there was a totally different experience, so much so that I went and joined the WRAF. At the end of a very hard 10 weeks training we had to give 3 choices for our preffered postings. My first was St Mawgan here in Cornwall which I didnt get, I got my second choice RAF Uphavon in Wiltshire.

Whilst training I loved to march for which I scored very high marks. Having been at Uphaven for a few months I was called into my Warrant Officer who advised me I had been chosen to go to London for the rememberance service at the Cenotaph and the Royal Albert hall in the evening. I was shocked, scared

but felt very honoured.

Marching from Chelsea barracks to the Cenotaph in November was so cold and being fairly tall I was always front marker when marching anywhere and that day was no different, lovely for those tucked behind you with the wind and rain hitting me, that together with the new best blue unifiorm on and shirt starched within an inch of its life, the blisters forming were

very painful.

Being in line at the Cenotaph to stand for the longest time waiting for the Queen and all officials to arrive you are told not to stare at the Grenadier Guards busbies as the bearskin flows in the wind and can be mesmerising, some did get dizzy and go down.

The most frightening part of the whole day was walking down the stairs and commencing to march, with getting the arms and

legs in sync is the most difficult.

Prior to the event our WRAF squadron were posted to RAF Northolt which was the Queens Squadron to be trained for a week to march to the stairs and commence marching after coming down. However I managed to do it correctly. Standing in the arena alongside fellow armed forces and volunteer forces waiting for the poppies to fall was so moving, maintaining your composure was very difficult. A day in my life to remember..


#### Welcome to our New Reception Children

We learnt about **algorithms**, **programming** and even managed to successfully **debug** faulty programs. How lucky we are to have access to such innovative, exciting technology. #### **Creative Arts and Music**

At St Day and Carharrack Primary School, we value the arts and music to support positive wellbeing. We see every day how they help all of our children grow in confidence, learn to express who they are and voice their thoughts and opinions across the whole curriculum. With this in mind we have set out this academic year, with a new bespoke curriculum written by our art and design subject leader, to develop and improve our art offer in school. We want our children to experience a range of mediums and materials while championing local and global artists and celebrating diversity. We did it! Over 2000 poppies crocheted and knitted by our group and community. We used our craft group on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> October to start attaching all of the poppies to the net we will be using in our display, and look forward to unveiling the finished project at the church for Remembrance week.

The last few months have been very busy with poppy-making, but we have also taken part in the banner parade at the Methodist Church. Our new stunning banner, which was designed and created by Siobhan Robson, will be displayed in Mills Hall.

We meet on the first Monday of every month in Mills Hall, from 6.30pm to 9pm. There is no membership subscription – we are completely flexible! The cost for each session is  $\mathfrak{L}2.50$  and this is to cover hall rental and your unlimited hot drinks and biscuits. We are entirely non-profit making and if we ever have a few busy months, the surplus entry fees get sent to Dementia UK, along with any fund-raising that we do. #### **United Downs Racetrack**

UDEG are working in partnership with Purple Cornwall Ltd, the company who run the *Banger Racetrack*. Together we are looking at the Green Lease requirements set by the landlord, Cornwall Council. Jointly, we are making extraordinary steps forward. One of the most exciting projects coming out of this work is the discovery of the rare and endangered flowering plants and ferns by Dr Colin French (PhD in Palaeoecology), May 2022. Colin's report identified 186 species in what looks like bleak, barren scrubland on the old mining site. It is quite the opposite! As a result, we potentially have on our doorstep a centre of natural wonders with a high level of biodiversity, presenting high nature conservation value (French, 2022). UDEG members working with Colin and Crispen, the proprietor, have learnt so much. We humbly recognise by listening, learning and reflecting from these people offers very different results to what we first expected. Thank You Dr French and Crispen Rosevear.

#### **Parish Council Achievements**

**New Benches** - we have installed two new benches in the village. One is at The Pound Field where you can enjoy the natural environment and find a sheltered spot even during the coming winter days. The other is on The Shute at the top of Shute Hill. It's quite a walk up there, but the views looking out towards the south of the county are wonderful. No excuses not to include this uphill stretch as part of a regular walk as we head into the shorter days of winter.

Big Bug Hotel - the parish council has agreed to install a bug hotel on the Pound Field as part of our conservation work in conjunction with the United Downs Environment Group. We are on the look out for any unwanted pallets. If you have one you would like to donate you can either drop it off at The Pound Field or make contact with any parish councillor or the clerk and we can arrange to collect it. Preferrably in good sound condition as we hope to build a hotel that stands the test of time.

Rats - we have received reports of rats in some areas of the village and provided the necessary council contacts for reporting this issue. Cornwall Council no longer has a vermin officer/team and responsibility for managing any investations lies with the homeowner or landlord. Please be mindful about keeping your rubbish (especially any foodstuffs) in places which are not accessible to these animals. Keep areas around the home and garden clear and tidy and be aware of any warm dry places where they might take up residence.

Community Working Group - we have started a commuity working group to help tidy up specific areas of the village. So far we have completed three x 1 hour sessions and managed to achieve quite a lot. We are hoping to continue with this meeting up on alternative Saturday mornings working from 9am - 10am. Just one hour twice a month. It's really great when passers-by stop and say thank you. We will put notices out on social media and the noticeboards with details of the next working group and if you would like to help just get in touch and we can contact you direct. No permanent commitment is required. But anytime you can give to your community is much appreciated.

**Volunteers -** are a valuable asset to any community. Do you have skills that are not being used at the moment? Do you have any ideas for the future of the village? Do you have some spare time which could be used to improve our environment or help exisiting groups with the community work they are doing?

The Parish Council is still in need of two people to fill the vacancies it has.

We would like to have a volunteer footpath officer to report any issues on our public footpaths and bridleways in the parish. You don't have to be a parish councillor to do this.

Looking to the future it would be good to have someone else to edit the Parish Magazine and it would be in the communities interest to begin to extend the community working group to incorporate the playing field.

ICE, The Carharrack Players, our Parish Churches, the Environment Group, the Social Club, Community Market and Mills Hall are always keen to hear from anyone who can lend a hand with events.

Many hands make light work - when volunteers become fewer, the load gets heavier and the amount they can for this community will be much less.

**Allotments:** All of our allotments have now been taken up. But if you wish to have an allotment don't be disheartened. Just let either the clerk or Cllr Val Aldridge know that you are interested and your name and contact details will go onto our waiting list.

It has been a challenging year for our allotment holders with such a cold and wet start to the year which delayed preparation and planting and subsequently poor results for some crops due to the reduced rate of germination, lack of insects and on-going poor weather conditions.

The Parish Council continues to support this valuable community and we wish you all a winter of happy hibernation with time to look through the seed catalogues and make your plans in readiness for when the days draw out again and you return with lots of ideas, energy and enthusiasm for your individual plots.

The Church of England is the 'established' church for England (& Cornwall) and is not a 'membership' church. The Parishes in which we all live mean that your church is there for you, even if you do not attend it, Baptism (Christening), Weddings and Funerals can all be conducted for you in your church.

The maintenance of church buildings is in the oversight of a Parochial Church Council, sometimes there might be confusion with a Parish Council, which is local 'government' and civil, the church being ecclesiastical.

The church do not get any precept assistance or monies from Government, National Trust or elsewhere.

All the money needed is raised through the good works and efforts of volunteers.

Despite the impression commonly held that the Church of England is rich, similar to inherited wealth, owing land and property does not pay day to day bills.

St Pirans Church, Carharrack is very much at the heart of the village.

Families have come to mark their threshold events and we want the church to thrive and continue to be there

An independent user, with the Church of the Cross, Pastor Graham, hires the building for worship each Sunday.

The Church of England own the building and offer Communion there each month.

The environment around the church, boundary wall, roof and guttering have all been or are being repaired and upgraded.

Recently it has been realised the Bell Tower requires attention and renovation. The estimate for this is more than we currently have available to start the work. I wanted to draw this to the residents of Carharrack's attention.

Invite you warmly to come to your church, support us with your prayers and yes, money.

Look out for fundraising events, help us to keep the church both as a building and holy space at the heart of the community.
